Knights of Honor

"Sufficient for me is that honor which is not seen of men but is felt in the heart, as faithful is He who hath promised and who never lies." ~ St. Patrick

As Knights and Dames of the Grand Priory of the United States of America, and more locally as members of the Priory of the Holy Isle, an important aspect to our being is to help in the recovery and preservation of the spirit and ideals of chivalry; to which, chivalry is a personal code of honor. According to the 'Manual of the Order' of The Sovereign Military Order of the Temple of Jerusalem, "Honor is nothing if it does not exist in the sight of God. True honor endures only if it is returned to God in the form of good deeds."

Throughout the generations, many have abused the idea of honor. They have used it as a means to manipulate. This has been especially true amongst leaders who interpret honor as complete accord or total compliance towards their will. However, that is not the picture which the Bible portrays.

Honor is not about control. Alternatively, we find that it's about celebrating the talents of others while expressing our faithfulness, and thankfulness, to God. It's looking for the good in people and then giving voice to their God given value. Honor is the deliberate choice to use our words and execution to show respect, esteem, and interest for others without feeling threatened by their accomplishments. As Knights and Dames, it's a willingness to recognize those who have travelled before us, beside us, and even after us, and then to award their gifts, sacrifices, and devotion. Honor is a two-way street. It's delivered up and down, and side by side; it's expressed through our attitudes and actions.

The point to be made here is that the world in which we reside is corrupt because it does not give to God the honor He deserves. The one who honors the world and the things of it makes himself an enemy of God. Saint Paul the apostle wrote in Romans 1:21, "For even though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God or give thanks, but they became futile in their speculations, and their foolish heart was darkened". The Bible teaches that honor is found in God and His Son and in our being like Him. We are to give obedience to Him through the fruits of our labors, as well as through the care and nurture of our bodies. To esteem God as first in our lives is thereby expressed in both the total commitment of our lives and devotion of our possessions to His service and glory.

By living by our motto, "Not unto us, O Lord, not unto us, but unto thy name give glory", we are truly giving unto God the honor for which is most deserved. For we did not make it here ourselves, but through the hard work and determination of those willing to place God above all else to ensure His works be done. We are his hands and feet, and together we can ensure that those in the world at large can know the glory of His kingdom, here on earth. So go, and be Knights and Dames of honor, for His glory!

CHANCELLOR'S MESSAGE




